## B. FCRTA 2019-20 Annual Budget Draft [INFORMATION]

<u>Summary:</u> Summary: Fresno County Rural Transit Agency's draft budget has been prepared to reflect Fresno COG's Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) and the Short-Range Transit Plan (SRTP) for the rural Fresno County area, 2020-2024.

The document recommends continuing existing services and capital improvements. This year's draft budget has been developed to include continued review, comment and action during its 45-day public review period which has been initiated by TTC and PAC on May 10, 2019 that will culminate on June 27, 2019 with the scheduled FCRTA Board meeting following a public hearing. The numbers in the draft budget are subject to refinement following service contract negotiations, an opportunity for public presentations and a public presentation before the Board of Directors. The budget, which may require

periodic amendments during the 2019-2020 fiscal year, is available on Fresno COG's website www.fresnocog.org and FCRTA's website www.ruraltransit.org.

## C. 2020-2024 Short Range Transit Plan for the Rural Fresno County Area Draft [INFORMATION]

<u>Summary:</u> The draft Short Range Transit Plan (SRTP) for the rural Fresno County area has been developed by the Fresno Council of Governments (Fresno COG), and updated by FCRTA in cooperation with the Cities of Coalinga, Firebaugh, Fowler, Huron, Kerman, Kingsburg, Mendota, Orange Cove, Parlier, Reedley, Sanger, San Joaquin, Selma and County of Fresno. The SRTP for the rural Fresno County area provides a five (5) year action-oriented program to implement the Public Transportation Element of the Regional transportation Plan (2018). The SRTP is also consistent with the recently adopted Fresno County Regional Long-Range Transit Plan (LRTP) 2019-2050. The 45-day public review process has been initiated by TTC and PAC on May 10, 2019 with a proposed adoption of June 27, 2019 following a public hearing. The document is available for your review on the Fresno COG website <a href="https://www.fresnocog.org">www.fresnocog.org</a> and the FCRTA website <a href="https://www.ruraltransit.org">www.ruraltransit.org</a>.

# D. <u>Temporary Maintenance Facility Lease Agreement Extension [APPROVE]</u>

<u>Summary:</u> The Board approved in July 2018, the one (1) year lease agreement (8/15/2018-8/15/2019) for a temporary maintenance facility while the permanent maintenance facility is being built. The temporary site in Selma has been located at 1870 Dockery Ave in the City of Selma across from the City yard and around the corner from the new maintenance facility site. FCRTA maintenance services will remain at this location and renew the lease for an additional year while the new maintenance facility is being constructed. The agreement extension is attached for your review (ATTACHMENT).

<u>Action:</u> Staff recommends Board approval of the agreement extension for the maintenance facility lease not to exceed one (1) year (8/15/2019-8/15/2020).

# E. <u>Safety and Security Service Agreements with the Cities of Mendota, Selma, Reedley and Fowler</u> for FY 2019-20 [APPROVE]

<u>Summary:</u> FCRTA is continuing the Safety and Security service for passengers and drivers with this collaborative partnership that has proven beneficial and continues to be very successful for the Police Departments of these cities and FCRTA. Our passenger incidents and 911 calls have decreased over the three (3) years since this program has been in place. Each contract has a maximum of \$10,000.00 annual payment for costs associated with providing this service of boarding buses when they are at transit stops and monitoring bus shelters. The safety and security agreements with the Cities of Mendota, Selma, Reedley and Fowler are available at the FCRTA website <a href="www.ruraltransit.org">www.ruraltransit.org</a> for your review.

<u>Action:</u> Staff recommends Board approval and authorize General Manager to execute agreements for each City in the amount not to exceed \$10,000.00 for FY 2019-2020.

# F. City of Dinuba Transit Agreement for FY 2019-2020 [APPROVE]

<u>Summary:</u> This is a regional public transit service agreement renewal with the City of Dinuba which mainly transports college students to Reedley Community College, the DMV, and shopping in the City of Reedley. This agreement is for \$51,000 and is effective from 7/01/19 to 6/30/20. The Dinuba agreement is available at the FCRTA website <a href="www.ruraltransit.org">www.ruraltransit.org</a> for your review.

Action: Staff recommends Board approval and authorize General Manager to execute agreement.

# G. Kings Area Rural Transit Agreement for FY 2019-20 [APPROVE]

<u>Summary:</u> This is a regional public transit service agreement renewal with the Kings Area Rural Transit for services from Kings County in Fresno County; Selma Kaiser, Downtown Fresno, Community Regional Center, Veterans Hospital, Fresno Kaiser and Children's Hospital. Also added this year will be service to the Valley Children's Clinic in Fowler when it opens this summer. This agreement is for \$60,000 and is effective 7/01/19 to 6/30/20. Action: Staff recommends Board approval and authorize General Manager to execute agreement.

Action: Staff recommends Board approval of Resolution No. 2019-07.



# B. 2019 Annual CHP-Motor Carrier Division Terminal, Vehicle and Driver Inspection Report [APPROVE]

Moses informed the board that FCRTA completed the Annual CHP Inspection Report. This Annual Report includes the inspection of the terminal, driver records and vehicles. General public transit is highly regulated in terms of safety and drivers and what that encompasses is the vehicle inspection annually along with every thirty (30) or forty-five (45) day inspections. Also involved in this terminal inspection is the Drug and Alcohol testing both pre-employment, reasonable suspicious and random. This is critical to the industry and we must comply. The satisfactory rating means that we can continue operations and remain eligible for state and federal funding.

# C. <u>Federal Transit Administration (FTA) Section 5311 Certifications & Assurances FY 2019</u> [APPROVE]

Moses informed the board that this is a standard boiler plate Certifications & Assurances that is attached to Caltrans 5311 funding. We get approximately \$1.5 million in operating assistance. This is a requirement of the funding application and we are asking for your approval and it has been reviewed by legal counsel. A motion was made by Mayor Silva (Mendota) and second by Mayor Leon (Huron). A vote was called and motion carried.

#### D. Appoint Committee to Negotiate Employment Agreement of General Manager [APPROVE]

Board has appointed three (3) Board Members to negotiate employment agreement with Moses as it expires September 30, 2019. The three board members that volunteered are Mayor Robertson (Selma), Mayor Pro Tem Yep (Kerman) and Council Member Beck (Reedley). The three committee members will return to full Board with a proposed agreement.

A motion was made by Mayor Lopez (Orange Cove) and second by Mayor Robertson (Selma). A vote was called and motion carried.

# AMENDMENT I TO THE LEASE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE FRESNO COUNTY RURAL TRANSIT AGENCY AND DANIEL SERIMIAN

This Amendment I to Agreement ("Amendment I") amends that certain agreement entered into on August 20, 2018, between the FRESNO COUNTY RURAL TRANSIT AGENCY (herein after referred to as "TENANT") and DANIEL SERIMIAN, (herein after referred to as "LANDLORD"), whereby LANDLORD agreed to lease the real property located at 1870 Dockery Avenue, Selma CA 93662 (herein after referred to as PROPERTY) to TENANT, (hereinafter referred to collectively as the "Agreement"); and

Whereas, an amendment to the Agreement is necessary to extend the lease into the next fiscal year; and

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration for their mutual promises, TENANT and LANDLORD agree to amend the Agreement as follows:

1. That existing Section 2.TERM AND RENT; shall be deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following:

"Landlord leases to Tenant the above Property for a term of one (1) year, commencing August 20, 2019, and terminating on August 20, 2020 (hereinafter referred to as "Lease Term"), or sooner as provided herein at the monthly rental amount of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00), payable each month for that month's rental installment payment, with the total amount of Sixty Thousand Dollars (\$60,000.00) rent to be paid over this Lease Term. Each monthly rental installment payment shall be due on the twentieth (20<sup>th</sup>) day of each calendar month during the Lease Term. All rental payments shall be made to Landlord, Daniel Serimian, at the address identified in Section 15 of this Lease or at such other place designated by written notice form Landlord to Tenant."

# **Conditions of Grant Acceptance**

Grant work cannot begin until all Conditions of Grant Acceptance have been satisfied. To assist with this process, Caltrans District staff will schedule a teleconference with your agency to discuss the conditions below, as well as other project revisions that may be necessary to accept grant funding. Please submit the below items to Caltrans District 6 no later than July 15, 2019. Failure to satisfy these conditions will result in the forfeiture of grant funds.

- 1. Coordinate with Caltrans District Planning staff to make necessary revisions to the Grant Application Cover Sheet, Scope of Work, and Project Timeline. Initial review of these documents require the following revisions:
  - Revise the Project Timeline to ensure the required local match of 11.47 percent is satisfied with every Request for Reimbursement/invoice.
  - Refine the Scope of Work. Provide details to substantiate the high costs in Tasks 1.4 and 3.2. Consider reducing the costs in Tasks 1.2 and 1.3.
  - Ensure the Grant Application Cover Sheet identifies a non-federal local match source.
- 2. A current (less than one year old) Local Resolution signed by the governing board that includes the grant project title and job title of the person authorized to enter into a contract with Caltrans.
- 3. Although the Payee Data Record (STD. 204) states government entities are not required to submit the form, it is required by Caltrans Accounting to ensure payments are sent to the correct recipient and address.
- 4. If requesting reimbursement for indirect costs, these costs must be included in the grant Scope of Work and Project Timeline. An Indirect Cost Allocation Plan (ICAP) must be submitted to Caltrans Audits and Investigations. Instructions for submitting an ICAP are available at the following webpage: http://dot.ca.gov/audits/
- 5. If utilizing third-party in-kind contributions to satisfy the minimum local match requirement, a Third-Party In-kind Valuation Plan must be completed. These contributions consist of goods and services donated from outside the grantee's agency (examples: donated printing, facilities, interpreters, equipment, advertising, staff time, and other goods or services). A Third-Party In-kind Valuation Plan Checklist and sample can be found at the following webpage: http://www.dot.ca.gov/hq/tpp/offices/orip/Grants/grants.html

## **Next Steps**

Once the District has approved all items required to fulfill the Conditions of Grant Acceptance, the following steps will need to occur:

- The Caltrans Division of Procurement and Contracts will send a draft contract for review and signature. Once the contract is signed, Caltrans District staff will send a Notice to Proceed letter. Grant work cannot begin until this letter is received by the grantee.
- Caltrans District staff will schedule a grant kick-off meeting with Caltrans staff and the grantee.
- Grant administrative requirements:
  - Quarterly Progress Reports (a brief narrative of completed project activities)

- o Request for Reimbursements/invoices (RFRs) at least quarterly, but no more than monthly.
- o Local match commitments in the amount shown above, including any local match amount above the minimum amount that is required with every RFR/invoice.
- o All work must be completed by February 28, 2022.
- o Final RFR/invoice and final product due no later than April 28, 2022. The final RFR/invoice will not be processed by Caltrans until the final product is submitted
