B. 2020 Annual Unmet Transit Needs [INFORMATION]

<u>Summary:</u> As the administrator of Transit Development Act (TDA) funds for Fresno County, the Fresno Council of Governments must complete the Unmet Transit Needs Study. The purpose of this study is to ensure that any unmet transit needs that are found reasonable to meet are met before TDA funds are expanded for non-transit use. Fresno COG, in cooperation with FAX, Clovis Transit, FEOC and FCRTA will be holding a total of six (6) public outreach meetings in February and March in urban and rural communities in Fresno County. Members of the public will be able to give testimony and convey perceived deficiencies within each transit system.

The information gathered as part of the public outreach will be included in a report called the Unmet Transit Needs Assessment. This report will be reviewed by the Social Services Transportation Advisory Council (SSTAC) who will provide a recommendation for unmet transit needs findings to the Fresno COG in May or June of 2020. The flyer is attached for you information (ATTACHMENT).

Action: Information only. The Board may provide direction at its discretion.

C. FCRTA Maintenance Facility Project in the City of Selma [INFORMATION]

Summary: The Board approved in April 2018 to designate the City of Selma as the preferred location for the FCRTA maintenance facility. FCRTA has purchased four (4) parcels in the City of Selma totaling approximately 10 acres to construct a new state-of-the-art bus maintenance and operations facility with solar, CNG fueling station, and electric vehicle charging infrastructure. FCRTA would like to pursue negotiations for an additional adjoining parcel located at 1200 Valley View with an existing building to expedite the transition to the new facility for the operations and dispatching. Staff will return to the Board with an appraisal and recommendation for this additional parcel. The parcel map is attached for your information (ATTACHMENT).

The new maintenance facility will be funded by The Federal Transit Administration (FTA) 5339 Grant, SB1 State of Good Repair and local Measure C funds totaling \$13 million. FCRTA must prepare National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) documents for categorical exclusion as a requirement to be in compliance and receive FTA funding (\$5.1 million). The parcels have already been given a Categorical Exemption under CEQA.

Action: Information only. The Board may provide direction at its discretion.

D. Federal Transit Administration (FTA) Section 5311 Application 2019-20 [APPROVE]

Summary: The application to Caltrans for operating assistance was submitted on February 12, 2020 via the electronic "Black Cat" system. This funding apportionment is used by FCRTA for the operation of all subcontracted transit services in the annual budget. The application is for \$1,669,771. This is an increase of approximately \$90,000 over the previous years allocation.

Action: Staff recommends Board approval of the 2019-20 FTA 5311 operating assistance application to Caltrans and adoption of Board Resolution No. 2020-04.

E. Low Carbon Transit Operations Program Application [APPROVE]

Summary: FCRTA was recently notified of our annual funding allocation from the Low Carbon Transit Operations Program (LCTOP) through Caltrans. The allocation amount of \$449,443.00 will be used to purchase one (1) thirty (30) foot BYD electric bus and will be used on one of the existing FCRTA routes. The balance of funds to complete the purchase will be approximately \$54,357.00 match with Measure C funding. Attached are Resolution No.2020-02 and No.2020-03 for your review (Attachment).

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

What is the purpose of the unmet transit needs meetings?

The meetings provide an opportunity for the public to identify all Fresno County "unmet transit needs" that are "reasonable to meet" within Fresno County (PUC 99401.5 (d).

What is an "unmet transit need"?

An "unmet transit need" is an inadequacy in existing public transit service from one location to another for persons recognized as transit dependent in Fresno County.

Who is "transit dependent"?

The "transit dependent" are those individuals who rely on public transit because they do not operate a vehicle because of youth, advanced age, mental or physical impairment or low income.

What is the purpose of the Social Services Transportation Advisory Council (SSTAC)?

The purpose of SSTAC is to receive public comment regarding transit service needs for the transit-dependent in Fresno County.



RESOLUTION SUPPORTING CLAIM AND SUBSEQUENT ACTIONS TO RECEIVE FY 2019-20 FUNDS FTA SECTION 5311 FUNDS

WHEREAS, Title 21 of the California Administrative Code, Section 1666 requires that the Fresno Council of Governments (FCOG), as the Regional Transportation Planning Agency (RTPA) for Fresno County to plan and program projects of local significance, so applicants, may reference their Applications in a "Program of Projects" (POP) for submittal through the State of California, Department of Transportation (Caltrans) to the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) Section 5311 program; and

WHEREAS, the FCRTA is an eligible applicant of such funds; and

WHEREAS, FCRTA has participated in the ongoing rural public transportation process with the FCOG; and

WHEREAS, the FCRTA does approve the contents and intent of an "Operating Assistance" Application for the Section 5311 funds for 2019-20, for submittal to the FCOG for their action; and

WHEREAS, the FCOG, later this year will adopt the 2020 Federal Transportation Improvement Program (FTIP) to include FCRTA's 2019-20 FTA Section 5311 Operating Grant Application; with reference in the "Program of Projects" (POP); and

WHEREAS, the FCOG shall transmit Certification and Assurance of the recommended Application directly to the Caltrans District 06 Office by their stipulated deadline; and

WHEREAS, the Application Process requires that the FCRTA Board of Directors affirm by Resolution it's policy (as contained in the Agency's official and legal Joint Powers Agreement) to seek, support and enter into grant agreements or contracts for and in behalf of its Member Agencies, and enter into the necessary FTA Section 5311 Assurances to be the recipient of said funds for the purposes expressed in its submitted Grant Application; and

WHEREAS, the FCRTA Board of Directors does hereby authorize the General Manager to execute any and all said Agreements and Contracts pertaining to the aforementioned Grant Program.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Fresno County Rural Transit Agency does affirm its intent to be the sole recipient and contracting authority for its 2019-20 FTA Section 5311 funds in the amount of \$1,669,771, thus not requiring each Member Agency's policy board to act individually in the matter.
