#### A. FCRTA 2022-2023 Annual Budget [APPROVE]

<u>Summary:</u> The Budget has been prepared to reflect the Fresno Council of Governments (FCOG) 2018 Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) and the Short Range Transit Plan for the Rural Fresno County Area for 2022-2026. The Budget and narrative recommends the implementation of programmed service improvements and continuation of existing services. The budget, which may require periodic amendments during the 2022-2023 fiscal year, is available on FCRTA's website ruraltransit.org.

<u>Action:</u> Open the public hearing, receive comments, and close the public hearing. Staff recommends Board approval of the FY 2022-23 Budget and adoption of Resolution No.2022-07.

## C. <u>Consolidated Transportation Services Agency (CTSA) Operations Program & Budget FY 2022-23 [APPROVE]</u>

Summary: The Consolidated Transportation Service Agency's (CTSA) Operations Program and Budget (OPB) for 2022-23 is available on FCRTA's website at: <a href="www.ruraltransit.org">www.ruraltransit.org</a>. The document is designed to provide an overview of how and in what manner the CTSA will provide social service transportation throughout Fresno County over the next fiscal year. The OPB consists of an urban component and a rural component. Sole-designee for the urban CTSA is the City of Fresno/FAX and the sole-designees for the rural CTSA is the Fresno County Rural Transit Agency (FCRTA). For FY 2022-23 the rural LTF pass through totals \$200,000 for FCRTA to provide social service transportation including meal delivery as needed in the rural areas.

<u>Action:</u> Staff recommends Board approval of the Consolidated Transportation Services Agency (CTSA) Operations Program & Budget FY 2022-23.

## D. <u>Amendment II to the Fresno Economic Opportunities Commission Contractor Services</u> <u>Agreement [APPROVE]</u>

<u>Summary:</u> In 2020, the FCOG re-designated the CTSA's in the following: FCRTA is now the sole designee for Rural Fresno County and administers the funding, activities, and transportation programs of all CTSA service providers in Rural Fresno County and the City of Fresno (FAX) is the sole designee for the Fresno Metropolitan Area and administers the funding, activities, and transportation programs of all CTSA service providers within the Fresno Metropolitan Area. Through a NOFA process, Fresno Economic Opportunities Commission (FEOC) was selected as the primary provider of CTSA services. The Board approved in June 2021, the Contractor Services Agreement with FEOC to provide the CTSA services. It is necessary and desirable that FCRTA extend this agreement until June 30, 2023 to continue to provide CTSA services to rural Fresno County. The Amendment II to the FEOC Contractor Services Agreement is attached for your review (ATTACHMENT).

**Action:** Staff recommends Board approval of Amendment II to the FEOC Contractor Services Agreement.

#### E. Temporary Maintenance Facility Lease Agreement Extension [APPROVE]

<u>Summary:</u> The Board approved in June 2021, the one (1) year lease agreement (8/15/2021-8/15/2022) for a temporary maintenance facility while the permanent maintenance facility is being built. The temporary site in Selma is located at 1870 Dockery Ave in the City of Selma across from the City yard and around the corner from the new maintenance facility site. FCRTA maintenance services will remain at this location and renew the lease for an additional year while the new maintenance facility is being constructed. The agreement extension is attached for your review (ATTACHMENT).

<u>Action:</u> Staff recommends Board approval of the agreement extension for the maintenance facility lease not to exceed one (1) year (8/15/2022-8/15/2023).

#### F. Safety and Security Service Agreements for FY 2022-23 [APPROVE]

**Summary:** FCRTA is continuing the Safety and Security service for passengers and drivers with this collaborative partnership that has proven beneficial and continues to be very successful for the Police Departments of all 13 member agencies and FCRTA. Our passenger incidents and 911 calls have decreased over the five (5) years since this program has been in place. Each contract has a maximum of \$10,000.00 annual payment for costs associated with providing this service of boarding buses when they are at transit stops and monitoring bus shelters. The agreement is available at the FCRTA website <a href="https://www.ruraltransit.org">www.ruraltransit.org</a>.

<u>Action:</u> Staff recommends Board approval and authorize General Manager to execute agreements for each City in the amount not to exceed \$10,000.00 for FY 2022-2023.

#### G. Amendment II to the Walker Contractor Services Agreement [APPROVE]

<u>Summary:</u> The Board approved in June 2021, the extension to the Contractor Services Agreement with Walker Consultants in the amount not to exceed \$60,000. It is necessary and desirable that FCRTA extend this agreement until June 30, 2023 to continue to provide technical assistance with specific transit related EV, mobility and capital grant projects. FCRTA anticipates pursuing additional local, state and federal funding opportunities and will require the additional technical assistance. The Amendment II to the Walker Consultants Contractor Services Agreement is attached for your review (ATTACHMENT).

<u>Action:</u> Staff recommends Board approval of Amendment II to the Walker Consultants Contractor Services Agreement in the amount not to exceed \$60,000.

#### H. Amendment II to the Inspiration Transportation Contractor Services Agreement [APPROVE]

<u>Summary:</u> The Board approved in July 2021, the extension to the Contractor Services Agreement with Inspiration Transportation. It is necessary and desirable that FCRTA extend this agreement until June 30, 2023 to continue to provide a rural rideshare service to provide access to rides to isolated and disadvantaged communities in Biola and West Park. FCRTA will only be providing the dispatching software and tablets to Inspiration Transportation. The Amendment II to the Inspiration Transportation Contractor Services Agreement is attached for your review (ATTACHMENT).

<u>Action:</u> Staff recommends Board approval of Amendment II to the Inspiration Transportation Contractor Services Agreement.

#### I. Kings Area Rural Transit Agreement for FY 2022-23 [APPROVE]

<u>Summary:</u> This is a regional public transit service agreement renewal with the Kings Area Rural Transit for services from Kings County in Fresno County; Selma Kaiser, Valley Children's Clinic in Fowler, Downtown Fresno, Community Regional Center, Veterans Hospital, Fresno Kaiser and Children's Hospital. This agreement is for \$60,000 and is effective 7/01/22 to 6/30/23. The KART agreement is available at the FCRTA website <a href="https://www.ruraltransit.org">www.ruraltransit.org</a> for your review.

Action: Staff recommends Board approval and authorize General Manager to execute agreement.

#### J. Amendment VI to the Agreement for Contractor Services with MV Transportation [APPROVE]

<u>Summary:</u> The Board approved in September 2020 Amendment IV to the Agreement for Contractor Services with MV. This Amendment IV continued contracted services with MV Transportation for an additional 4 years (2021-2025) which was an option in the 2018 Request for Proposal (RFP). This Amendment required approval from Caltrans staff as they approved the original 2018 RFP and Contractor Services Agreement. Staff is recommending extending the contractor services agreement for the 2<sup>nd</sup> year of the 4 option years. Caltrans has reviewed and approved Amendment VI on May 19, 2022. The approval letter from Caltrans and the Amendment VI to the Agreement for Contractor Services with MV Transportation is attached for your review (ATTACHMENT).

<u>Action:</u> Staff recommends Board approval of the Amendment VI and authorize General Manager to execute Amendment VI to the Agreement for Contractor Services with MV Transportation.

#### K. Amendment III to the Agreement for Maintenance Services with City of Selma [APPROVE]

<u>Summary:</u> As a result of the 2018 Request for Proposals (RFP), City of Selma was awarded a three (3) year agreement to provide maintenance services to the FCRTA vehicle fleet. Staff is recommending extending the maintenance services agreement. The option to renew the contract for an additional 4 years in one year increments was included as an option in the 2018 RFP. Amendment III to the Agreement for Maintenance Services with City of Selma is attached for your review (ATTACHMENT).

<u>Action:</u> Staff recommends Board approval of the Amendment III and authorize General Manager to execute Amendment III to the Agreement for Maintenance Services with City of Selma.

#### L. FCRTA Transportation Development Act (TDA) Claim [APPROVE]

**Summary:** FCRTA is claiming \$ in Transportation Development Act funding in support of the \$15,301,604 FY 2022-23 operating budget and \$45,735,930.67 capital budget. In 2020, the FCOG redesignated the CTSA's and FCRTA is now the sole designee for Rural Fresno County and administers the funding, activities, and transportation programs of all CTSA service providers in Rural Fresno County. FCRTA is claiming \$739,269 in Transportation Development Act (TDA) Article 4.5 funding in support of the 2022-23 Rural Consolidated Transportation Service Agency (CTSA) budget. FCRTA pass through totals \$200,000 for FCRTA to provide social service transportation and meal delivery in the rural areas and \$539,269 of the funding to FEOC through a Contractor Services Agreement to provide CTSA social service transportation. This is in compliance with the Rural CTSA objectives. The CTSA OPB is available on Fresno COG's website <a href="fresnocog.org">fresnocog.org</a> and the FCRTA website <a href="www.ruraltransit.org">www.ruraltransit.org</a>. The TDA Claim is attached for your review (ATTACHMENT).

Action: Staff recommends Board approval of the TDA claim and adoption of Board Resolution No. 2022-09.

#### M. New Technology Grant Application- Resiliency Hub Project [APPROVE]

<u>Summary:</u> FCRTA is submitting an application to the FCOG New Technology Grant Program to construct a resiliency hub, including a solar carport and electric vehicle charging system on a public parking lot located at 1399 Draper Street, Kingsburg, CA 93621, adjacent to the Fresno County Kingsburg Branch Library. The solar carport will include Level II electric vehicle charging infrastructure that will enable

FCRTA to transition to a fully electric vehicle fleet. The solar carport and EV charging system will help FCRTA overcome these challenges by powering their electric vehicle (EV) fleet and allowing FCRTA to expand their innovative on-demand EV Micro Transit service to bring more riders to the system and better connect rural communities to jobs, healthcare, social services, and other quality of life locations. The solar chargers would also further reduce reliance on the electrical grid, bringing FCRTA's fleet closer to zero emission and net zero solution.

Action: Staff recommends Board approval of the New Technology Grant application in the amount of \$598,000 and adoption of Resolution No. 2022-08.

#### N. New Technology Grant Application-Inductive Charging Unit Project [APPROVE]

<u>Summary:</u> FCRTA is submitting an application to the FCOG New Technology Grant Program to install a WAVE inductive charging unit at the FCRTA Maintenance Facility in Selma. The inductive charging unit provides a wireless, fast charger, without a plugin requirement that will enable FCRTA to quickly charge vehicles providing an efficient method to extend the mileage range of the bus to complete the route. The in-ground inductive rapid charging stations have a low profile and limited associated infrastructure. The WAVE inductive charging unit is a critical component for FCRTA to achieve the transition from gasoline and CNG vehicles to EV and ZEVs.

Action: Staff recommends Board Approval of the New Technology Grant application in the amount of \$469,250 and adoption of Resolution No. 2022-10.

#### O. AB 361- Future Board Meetings [APPROVE]

**Summary**: On Sept. 15, 2021, Governor Newsom signed Assembly Bill (AB) 361, amending the Ralph M. Brown Act to allow local agency councils, boards and committees to continue conducting public meetings remotely during a state of emergency after Oct. 1, 2021, so long as they make specific findings every 30 days, and ensure conditions related to public participation are satisfied. Under the Brown Act, the Policy Board, the FCRTA Board, TTC and PAC and other Fresno COG committees are considered "legislative bodies," according to the Fresno County Counsel's office. Under the urgency legislation, a local agency may use the more "relaxed" Brown Act teleconferencing/videoconferencing requirements in any of the following circumstances:

- There is a proclaimed state of emergency, and state or local officials have imposed or recommended measures to promote social distancing; or
- There is a proclaimed state of emergency, and the local agency's meeting is to determine, by majority vote, whether as a result of the emergency, meeting in person would present imminent risks to the health or safety of attendees; or
- There is a proclaimed state of emergency, and the local agency has determined, by majority vote, that as
  a result of the emergency meeting in person would present an imminent risk to the health or safety of
  attendees.

AB 361 defines a "state of emergency" as a state of emergency proclaimed pursuant to Section 8625 of the California Emergency Services Act. Importantly, this includes the Governor's proclaimed state of emergency due to the COVID-19 pandemic. To continue to rely on the relaxed video/teleconferencing provisions, the local agency must reconsider the circumstances of the state of emergency and make the following findings by majority vote, **every 30 days**:

- The state of emergency continues to directly impact the ability of members to meet safely in person; or
- State or local officials continue to impose or recommend measures to promote social distancing.

The recommended finding under this option would be that "The Board, meeting during a proclaimed state of emergency, has determined by majority vote, pursuant to AB 361 subparagraph (B), that, as a result of the emergency, meeting in person would present imminent risks to the health or safety of attendees."

While the Board has the option of using teleconferencing, as was available prior to COVID restrictions, the Brown Act requires: 1) a quorum of the legislative body to participate from within the boundaries of the agency's jurisdiction, 2) the public agency to post notice of each teleconference location, and 3) the public be allowed to address the legislative body from each teleconference location. These requirements place a significant burden on both Board members and staff.

Action: Staff recommends two actions:

- 1) That the Board issue the following findings: (a) The Board has reconsidered the circumstances of the state of emergency; and (b) As a result of the emergency, meeting in person would present imminent risks to the health or safety of attendees.
- 2) Reaffirm Resolution 2022-01 from Jan. 6, authorize the Board and subordinate legislative bodies to conduct their meetings in accordance with remote participation by teleconference in the manner provided by Government Code section 54953, subd. (e) through July 28, and direct staff to continue providing video/teleconferencing provisions for all FCRTA Board meetings through July 28.

# AMENDMENT II TO THE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE FRESNO COUNTY RURAL TRANSIT AGENCY AND FRESNO COUNTY ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITIES COMMISSION

This Amendment II to Agreement ("Amendment II") amends that certain agreement entered into on June 25, 2021 (hereinafter referred to as "Agreement"), between the FRESNO COUNTY RURAL TRANSIT AGENCY (herein after referred to as "FCRTA") and FRESNO COUNTY ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITIES COMMISSION, (herein after referred to as "CONTRACTOR"), whereby CONTRACTOR agreed to provide contractor services to FCRTA. FCRTA and CONTRACTOR may be referred to herein collectively as the "Parties" or individually as a "Party."

Whereas, the Parties entered into an Agreement ("Agreement") on June 25<sup>th</sup>, 2021 by Amendment I on February 24, 2022 and Contractor provides social services transportation to the rural areas of Fresno County as detailed in the Urban & Rural Social Service Transportation Proposed Operations Program & Budget FY 2022-2023; and

Whereas, the term of the Agreement is currently set to terminate on June 30, 2022; and

Whereas, the Parties wish to extend the term of the Agreement through

Whereas, an amendment to the Agreement is necessary to extend the Agreement into the next fiscal year; and

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration for their mutual promises, FCRTA and CONTRACTOR agree to amend the Agreement as follows:

- 1. That existing Section I. CONTRCTOR'S OBLIGATIONS shall be deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following:
- A. The CONTRACTOR shall perform all work necessary to operate the PROJECT. CONTRACTOR shall perform all operative and administrative tasks for the PROJECT. The PROJECT will cover the rural unincorporated communities of Fresno County with specific emphasis in serving Biola and West Park residents with micro-transit rides to non-emergency doctor appointments, grocery stores, social service and other related quality of life essential transportation. This will be provided with 24 hour advance reservations and real time based dispatching based on availability of drivers and vehicles.
- B. CONTRACTOR shall perform the tasks and services contemplated by this Agreement according to the PROJECT as set in Section I. Paragraph A. and according to the requirements of this Agreement.
- C. CONTRACTOR shall provide Electric Vehicles for this PROJECT. CONTRACTOR shall, at its sole expense, reasonably ensure that said vehicles are in good, operable condition, and shall, at its sole expense, provide automobile insurance policies which cover the CONTRACTOR's use of the vehicles and meet or exceed State minimum insurance standards as well as reasonable driver training, drug and alcohol testing for CONTRACTOR'S drivers.
- D. CONTRACTOR shall perform all services required pursuant to this Agreement in the manner and according to the standards observed by a competent practitioner of the profession in which CONTRACTOR is engaged in the geographical area in which CONTRACTOR practices his profession. All products of whatsoever nature which

CONTRACTOR delivers to FCRTA pursuant to this Agreement shall be prepared in a substantial, first class manner and conform to the standards of CONTRACTOR's profession.

- 2. That existing Section II. FCRTA's OBLIGATIONS shall be deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following:
- A. FCRTA shall make dispatching software and tablets available to CONTRACTOR for CONTRACTOR's use in performing its obligations under this Agreement and the PROJECT.
- B. FCRTA will make available to CONTRACTOR any non-privileged document, studies or other information in its possession related to the PROJECT.
- 3. That existing Section III. COMPENSATION shall be deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following:

The Parties understand, acknowledge, and agree that FCRTA will not be providing monetary compensation to CONTRACTOR beginning July 1, 2022.

4. That existing Section XIII. EFFECTIVE DATE, TERM: shall be deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following:

This Agreement shall become effective as of the date of its execution by the parties hereto and shall remain in full force and effect through June 30, 2023 unless sooner terminated or unless its term is extended. Upon the mutual written Agreement of the parties hereto, this Agreement may be extended beyond that date.

- 5. This Amendment II to Agreement shall become effective July 1, 2022 (hereinafter "Effective Date").

# AMENDMENT VI TO THE AGREEMENT FOR CONTRACTED SERVICES BETWEEN THE FRESNO COUNTY RURAL TRANSIT AGENCY AND MV TRANSPORTATION

This Amendment VI to Agreement ("Amendment VI") amends and restates a prior fifth amendment (hereinafter "Prior Amendment V"), approved on June 24, 2021, and amends that certain Agreement for Contracted Services (hereinafter "Agreement"), entered into on July 31, 2018, between the FRESNO COUNTY RURAL TRANSIT AGENCY (hereinafter "FCRTA") and MV PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION INC., a transportation services firm formed under the laws in the State of California (hereinafter "CONTRACTOR"), whereby CONTRACTOR agreed to provide contractor services to FCRTA. FCRTA and CONTRACTOR may be referred to herein collectively as the "Parties" and singularly as a "Party."

#### Recitals:

- A. The Agreement between FCRTA and CONTRACTOR had a three-year term and was set to expire on September 1, 2021.
- B. The Agreement was amended by Amendment I, approved on June 27, 2019, by Amendment II, approved on November 21, 2019, by Amendment III, executed on August 12, 2020, and by Amendment IV and V executed on July 21, 2021.
- C. The Agreement has been extended for up to four (4) additional years, in one-year increments, subject to Caltrans FTA Programs Procurement Oversight Branch and FCRTA Board of Directors approval.
- D. On July 21, 2021, the Parties approved Amendment IV, which extended the term of the Agreement by the full four (4) additional years.
- E. Pursuant to the terms of the Agreement and the direction of Caltrans FTA Programs Procurement Oversight Branch, the Parties wish to extend the term of the Agreement for its second one-year increment, through August 31, 2023.
- F. The Parties agree that an amendment to the Agreement is necessary and desirable to extend the contracted services through August 31, 2023.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration for their mutual promises, FCRTA and CONTRACTOR agree as follows:

- 1. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the Agreement, the term of the Agreement is extended through August 31, 2023.
- 2. That existing ARTICLE I, "AWARD OF A CONTRACT FOR TRANSIT SERVICE TO THE MV TRANSPORTATION," shall be deleted entirely and replaced with the following:

"The FCRTA hereby agrees to engage the MV Public Transportation, Inc., (Contractor) to provide public transportation service to the referenced subsystems, from September 1, 2018 through August 31, 2025. The maximum amount of compensation to the Contractor, under this Agreement is not to exceed: \$2,727,689.76 for FY 2018-19; \$3,164,105.59 for FY 2019-20; \$3,264,675.20 for FY 2020-21; \$3,477,588.00 for FY 2021-22; \$3,619,531.20 for FY 2022-23; \$3,761,473.00 for FY 2023-24; and \$3,974,387.20 for FY 2024-25 provided no

penalties or awards are assessed. **Exhibit - 1** displays Contractor's proposal pricing for each fiscal year of this agreement.

This Agreement, including FCRTA 2018 Operations and Maintenance Request for Proposals, the Proposal from the successful Contractor, and the exhibits attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference, constitutes the entire agreement between the Parties with respect to the Services, and supersedes all prior agreements or understandings, oral or written, between the Parties in this regard."

3. That existing Article IV, "BILLING AND PAYMENT FOR SERVICE," shall be deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following:

#### A. <u>2022-23 Service Year</u>

For services rendered between September 1, 2022 through August 31, 2023, and subject to Article I and Exhibit - 1 "Summary of FCRTA's Subsystem Individual and Total Contract Budgets for 2018-25 by Number of Vehicles, Total Service Hours, Hourly Contract rate and Calculated Contract Budgets", the Contractor shall submit an itemized (accounting of the actual number of service hours multiplied by \$51.00 - the rate per vehicle service hour) monthly service bill to FCRTA within thirty (30) days, following the given month in which services were rendered. Failure to do so will result in a 3% penalty to the Contractor per monthly occurrence and shall be deducted from a subsequent reimbursement billing payment. FCRTA shall make payment on the billing within thirty (30) days from receipt of said bill. Failure by FCRTA to do so will result in a 3% increase award to a subsequent reimbursement billing payment to the Contractor.

The maximum amount of compensation to the Contractor for the service year beginning on September 1, 2022 and ending on August 31, 2023, under this Agreement is not exceed \$3,619,531.20, provided no penalties or awards are assessed.

Additionally, Contractor will be providing insurance as defined in Article II Section J. and per Exhibit 1, at a cost of \$108,197.66 for the service year beginning on September 1, 2022 and ending on August 31, 2023 subject to vehicle miles traveled. FCRTA agrees to pay Contract the above-referenced 2022-23 service year insurance costs prior to September 1, 2022."

#### B. 2023-24 Service Year

For services rendered between September 1, 2023 through August 31, 2024, and subject to Article I and Exhibit - 1 "Summary of FCRTA's Subsystem Individual and Total Contract Budgets for 2018-25 by Number of Vehicles, Total Service Hours, Hourly Contract rate and Calculated Contract Budgets", the Contractor shall submit an itemized (accounting of the actual number of service hours multiplied by \$53.00 - the rate per vehicle service hour) monthly service bill to FCRTA within thirty (30) days, following the given month in which services were rendered. Failure to do so will result in a 3% penalty to the Contractor per monthly occurrence and shall be deducted from a subsequent reimbursement billing payment. FCRTA shall make payment on the billing within thirty (30) days from receipt of said bill. Failure by FCRTA to do so will result in a 3% increase award to a subsequent reimbursement billing payment to the Contractor.

The maximum amount of compensation to the Contractor for the service year beginning on September 1, 2023 and ending on August 31, 2024, under this Agreement is not exceed \$3761,473.60, provided no penalties or awards are assessed.

Additionally, Contractor will be providing insurance as defined in Article II Section J. and per Exhibit 1, at a cost of \$109,092.66 for the service year beginning on September 1, 2023 and ending on August 31, 2024 subject to vehicle miles traveled. FCRTA agrees to pay Contract the above-referenced 2023-24 service year insurance costs prior to September 1, 2023."

#### C. 2024-25 Service Year

For services rendered between September 1, 2024 through August 31, 2025, and subject to Article I and Exhibit - 1 "Summary of FCRTA's Subsystem Individual and Total Contract Budgets for 2018-25 by Number of Vehicles, Total Service Hours, Hourly Contract rate and Calculated Contract Budgets", the Contractor shall submit an itemized (accounting of the actual number of service hours multiplied by \$56.00 - the rate per vehicle service hour) monthly service bill to FCRTA within thirty (30) days, following the given month in which services were rendered. Failure to do so will result in a 3% penalty to the Contractor per monthly occurrence and shall be deducted from a subsequent reimbursement billing payment. FCRTA shall make payment on the billing within thirty (30) days from receipt of said bill. Failure by FCRTA to do so will result in a 3% increase award to a subsequent reimbursement billing payment to the Contractor.

The maximum amount of compensation to the Contractor for the service year beginning on September 1, 2024 and ending on August 31, 2025, under this Agreement is not exceed \$3,974,387.20, provided no penalties or awards are assessed.

Additionally, Contractor will be providing insurance as defined in Article II Section J. and per Exhibit 1, at a cost of \$109,996.62 for the service year beginning on September 1, 2024 and ending on August 31, 2025 subject to vehicle miles traveled. FCRTA agrees to pay Contract the above-referenced 2024-25 service year insurance costs prior to September 1, 2024."

- 4. This Amendment VI to Agreement shall become effective July 1, 2022 (hereinafter "Effective Date"), and shall supersede and replace Prior Amendment IV.
- 5. Upon the Effective Date, the Agreement, Amendment I, Amendment II, Amendment III, Amendment IV, Amendment V and this Amendment VI shall together constitute the Agreement.
- 6. Unless expressly modified by the terms of this Amendment VI, all terms of the Agreement, as modified by Amendments I through V, remain in full force and effect.
- 7. ## AMENDMENT III TO THE AGREEMENT FOR CONTRACTED SERVICES BETWEEN THE FRESNO COUNTY RURAL TRANSIT AGENCY

#### AND CITY OF SELMA

This Amendment III to Agreement (hereinafter "Amendment III") amends that certain Member Agency Services Agreement (hereinafter "Agreement"), entered into on July 31, 2018, between the FRESNO COUNTY RURAL TRANSIT AGENCY (hereinafter "FCRTA") and City of Selma, a municipal corporation (hereinafter "CITY"), whereby CITY agreed to provide services to FCRTA to maintain FCRTA's vehicle fleet. FCRTA and CONTRACTOR may be referred to herein collectively as the "Parties" and singularly as a "Party."

#### Recitals:

- A. The Agreement between FCRTA and CITY had a three-year term set to expire on September 1, 2021.
- B. The Agreement was amended by Amendment II and was extended for up to four (4) additional years, in one-year increments, subject to the FCRTA Board of Directors approval.
- C. The Parties wish to extend the term of the Agreement for the second year of the one-year increments.
- D. The Parties agree that an amendment to the Agreement is necessary and desirable to extend the contracted services through 2023.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration for their mutual promises, FCRTA and CITY agree to amend the Agreement as follows:

- 1. Notwithstanding any language to the contrary in SECTION 2 "TERM OF SERVICES" of the Agreement, the term of the Agreement shall be extended by one year through September 1, 2023.
- 2. That existing SECTION 4, "COMPENSATION, BILLING AND PAYMENT FOR SERVICE," shall be deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following:

The compensation to the CITY for Services under this Agreement shall not exceed \$925,238.90 for FY 2022-23; \$951,244.63 for FY 2023-24 and \$978,051.12 for FY 2024-25, as set forth in Exhibit 1, attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. City shall bill FCRTA for the Services set forth herein at the rates set forth in Exhibit 1. FCRTA has no responsibility to pay any sums beyond the compensation set forth in this Agreement. This amount may be amended by mutual written agreement between FCRTA and the City. FCRTA shall pay City for services rendered pursuant to this Agreement at the time and in the manner set forth herein. The payments specified below shall be the only payments from FCRTA to City for services rendered pursuant to this Agreement. City shall submit all invoices to the FCRTA in the manner specified herein:

4.1 <u>Invoices.</u> Subject to the previous Sections, the City shall submit a summarized monthly service bill to FCRTA within thirty (30) days, following the given month in which services were rendered on the fleet vehicles. The billing statement shall set forth the cost for services performed and reimbursable costs incurred prior to the invoice date. Invoices shall contain

the following information:

- **4.1.1** The beginning and ending dates of the billing period.
- 4.1.2 A detailed billing statement of all personnel, parts, supplies provided by the City during the invoice period with copies of work orders itemizing specific maintenance, or inspection, work performed to each respective vehicle, with a separate accounting of parts and fluids.
- **4.1.3** The City's Contract Administrator's signature.
- 4.2 <u>Service Fees.</u> The City will invoice the FCRTA for actual service(s) provided in accordance with the per the attached reimbursement schedule by job class. Invoices and billings by other independent vendors, under the City's direction, shall be coordinated by City maintenance personnel for recordkeeping and accountability requirements.
- 4.3 Parts. FCRTA shall reimburse City for the cost of all parts, fluids, and all things necessary to perform the required Services (the "Parts"), with the exception of personnel. FCRTA shall purchase and maintain all equipment necessary to provide the Services. The Parts are not included in the costs set forth in Exhibit 1, and are not subject to the dollar limitation set forth in this Section 4. The City shall not include any billing markup on Parts.
- **4.4** Payment by FCRTA. FCRTA shall make payment within thirty (30) days from receipt of said invoice.
- 3. This Amendment III shall become effective July 1, 2022 (hereinafter "Effective Date").
- 4. Upon the Effective Date, the Agreement, Amendment I, Amendment II, and this Amendment III shall together constitute the Agreement.
- 5. Unless expressly modified by the terms of this Amendment III, all terms of the Agreement remain in full force and effect.
- 6. Each Party represents and warrants to the other Party that such Party is duly authorized and empowered to execute, enter into, and perform its obligations set forth in this Amendment III, and that the individual signing this Amendment III on behalf of such Party has been duly authorized to execute this Amendment III on behalf of such Party, and will, by signing this Amendment III on such Party's behalf, legally bind such Party to the terms, covenants, and conditions of this Amendment III.
